SELCO Awarded Energy Efficient Street Lighting Grant

Massachusetts Municipal Wholesale Electric Company (MMWEC) has received a \$2.9 million dollar grant under the Department of Energy Resources (DOER) Rapid LED Streetlight Conversion Program.

The grant is part of a larger program awarded by the Baker-Polito Administration to more than 30 communities. The participating MMWEC member municipal light departments are located in Boylston, Chicopee, Holden, Holyoke, Hull, Ipswich, Mansfield, Marblehead, Paxton, Peabody, Princeton, Shrewsbury,

South Hadley, Templeton, Wakefield and West Boylston.

"Converting municipally owned streetlights into energy efficient LEDs will help cities and towns across the Commonwealth realize thousands of dollars in annual energy savings while reducing emissions," said Lieutenant Governor Karyn Polito. "LED streetlights help reduce energy usage during peak demand times, lessening the burden on our regional electric grid and reducing costs for all ratepayers."

LED streetlights are more energy efficient and longer-lasting than other common street lighting technologies; converting saves cities and towns money both on their electric bills and in operations and maintenance. LEDs offer a number of other advantages as well, including improved visibility, reduced light pollution, and the ability to install advanced controls such as dimming, remote control, and Wi-Fi capability.

SELCO has been working to upgrade to LEDs over the past few years. This grant will allow SELCO to expand on existing efforts to upgrade to energy efficient street lighting within the community. We anticipate being able to upgrade an additional 2,000 street lights to LEDs as a direct result of this grant.

NBC Boston and DVR Updates

NBC Boston is the new home for your favorite NBC programming, local news, and more!

Beginning January 1st, WBTS (SELCO Channel 10/310 HD) will broadcast NBC content. WHDH (SELCO Channel 7/307) will broadcast syndicated content and local news.



If you currently have a DVR set to record any NBC series on WHDH-7 you will want to change the settings so you don't miss out on your favorite shows.

You can either set a new recording from the guide for NBC series running on channel 10/310 or you can edit an existing series recording as follows:

- 1. Press the **LIST** button on your remote.
- 2. Press LIST again to access the DVR menu.
- 3. Use the arrow keys to navigate to **SERIES MANAGER** and press **SELECT**.
- SELECT the series you wish to edit then navigate to SERIES RECORDING
 OPTIONS and press SELECT.
- Navigate to CHANNELS and make sure you change it from 7 ONLY or 307 ONLY to read SD ONLY or HD ONLY (depending on your preference) and then press A to accept.

NOTE: Editing an existing recording works best for series that are selected to record "First Run Only" episodes.

Programming Changes

Effective January 1, 2017, SELCO will be launching NECN HD on channel 317. NBC Boston will launch on SELCO channel 10/310 HD. WHDH 7/307 HD will no longer carry NBC programming after the first of the year. SELCO will discontinue carriage of Reelz Channel and Sportskool VOD due to high costs and low viewership.
